

Ephesians 5:1-2, 15-21 ESV

1 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. 2 And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but **be filled with the Spirit**, 19 <u>addressing</u> one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, <u>singing and making</u> melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 <u>giving thanks</u> always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 <u>submitting</u> to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Ephesians 5:1-2 ESV

1 Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. 2 And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

- Because of Christ, we have a status (INDICATIVE):
 1) "beloved children" rather than spiritually dead and alienated (Eph 2);
 2) beneficiaries of the blessings flowing from Christ's sacrifice
- Because of our status, we have a **responsibility (IMPERATIVE**): 1) "be imitators of God"

2) "walk in love"

Ephesians 5:1-2, 15-21 ESV

15 Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. 17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but **be filled with the Spirit**, 19 <u>addressing</u> one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, <u>singing and making</u> melody to the Lord with your heart, 20 <u>giving thanks</u> always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, 21 <u>submitting</u> to one another out of reverence for Christ.

- vv. 15-18 uses parallelism (do this, don't do this)
- v. 18 Will you be controlled by wine or the Spirit?
- vv. 19-21 = 5 participles that are symptoms of being Spirit-filled.

Ephesians 5:21, 25-33a ESVWhat does this submission look like?21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.25 Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up
for her, 26 that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the
word, 27 so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle
or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. 28 In the same way
husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife
loves himself. 29 For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and
cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, 30 because we are members of his
body. 31 "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to
his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." 32 This mystery is profound, and
I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. 33 However, let each one of
you love his wife as himself, ...

Ephesians 5:21, 6:1-4 ESV What does this submission look like?

21 submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ.

6:1 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 2 "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), 3 "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land." 4 Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.
